

#### What do we do?


## Sing the rhyme with your wee one and try the signs if you can access the video

Little Bo Peep has lost her sheep And doesn't know where to find them Leave them alone And they'll come home Wagging their tails behind them

Let your wee one watch while you write out the words of the rhyme then help them to make their own marks or drawings
