What will your child learn from this play?

- How stories and songs work
- Vocabulary and language
- About how people are different
- How to play with others and manage setbacks
- About birds and eggs hatching
- About growing up and how we change

What do we do?

Find a quiet time to chat and enjoy the story

Your child may want to go through it a few times

There are a couple of games to play as well

For ideas for interacting with the story, use the "watch with top tips" version

Your child might like to retell the story, or draw some of the characters

- Help your child "write" their own version of the story this may be just a drawing and you can add some words
